H.E. Jack Lang President, Arab World Institute Former Minister of Culture, France

H.E. Jack Lang is a French politician. A member of the Socialist Party, he served as France's Minister of Culturefrom 1981 to 1986 and 1988 to 1992, and as Minister of Education from 1992 to 1993 and 2000 to 2002. He was also the Mayor of Blois from 1989 to 2000.

He served until 2012 in the National Assembly from the sixth district of Pas-de-Calais. Jack Lang studied political science at the Institut d'Études Politiques de Paris, and went on to receive a postgraduate degree in public law. His career then focused on a combination of teaching and culture and the arts.

He was the founder and producer of Festival du Monde in Nancy, was director of the Nancy University Theatre from 1963 to 1972, and then director of the Théâtre national de Chaillot from 1972 to 1974. At the same time he was a professor of international law from 1971 to 1981. Lang entered politics as a Socialist member of the French National Assembly from Paris in 1977.

He is best known for having served as Minister of Culture (22 May 1981 – 19 March 1986 and 13 May 1988 – 29 March 1993) and as Minister of Education (3 April 1992 – 29 March 1993 and 27 March 2000 – 5 May 2002).
